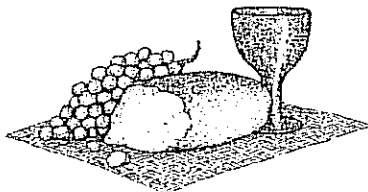

REFLECTIONS ON TODAY'S READINGS

YEAR C - Proper 4

(Revised Lectionary)

TODAY'S READINGS continue the Epiphany theme by showing how the Gospel of God is intended not just for Jews but for the Gentile world as well. Today the Gospel reading continues the readings from St Luke, and the Second Reading continues a course of readings from 1 Corinthians.

The First Reading (Jeremiah 1: 4-10) is Jeremiah's call to be a prophet of the Lord. He is called to proclaim the Word of God "to the nations" (v. 5) echoing one of the aspects of the Epiphany theme. Jeremiah was called even from before his birth (v. 5); that is, his call was part of God's plan. But like many of us, Jeremiah resisted God's call for he was unsure of himself and unwilling to speak out in public. So God assures him of his help.

The Second Reading (1 Corinthians 13: 1-13) is St Paul's glorious "hymn" to love. In chapter 12 Paul speaks of the various gifts of the Spirit, and how each gift is important. Note how he is careful to avoid the suggestion that the gift of tongues is the most significant (v. 10). What he does say is that love is what gives meaning to every other gift, and that love is the one gift that we carry with us into the eternal Kingdom. And he elaborates on the meaning of love. These days we tend to think of love as an emotion or feeling, but Christian love is better described as an attitude or intention. To love is to care. Love denotes the character of God, and it should also denote the character of each of his disciples.

The Gospel (Luke 4: 21-30) follows the Gospel reading for last Sunday when we heard how Jesus read the Scriptures in the synagogue of his home town amongst his friends, neighbours and family. He read from the book of Isaiah and then told the people that he was the one who fulfilled what the prophet was saying. At first the people were impressed, but then they began to doubt, for they knew him as "the boy who had grown up next door". Jesus then went on to say that God seems to work better amongst the Gentiles because his own people tend to resist him; and the people of Nazareth proved his point by their anger and hostility. Sometimes we see this kind of resistance even in our own parishes.
