REFLECTIONS ON TODAY'S READINGS

TODAY'S READINGS speak of God's righteousness. Ahab, having been tempted into sin, is rebuked by Elijah. Paul tells the Galatians that, although we are sinners, God accounts us as righteous on the basis of our faith in Christ. The immoral woman learned how Jesus forgives and sets us in the way of righteousness if we come to him in penitence and love.

The First Reading (1 Kings 21: 1-10, 15-21a) is the story of Naboth's vineyard, a tale of human wickedness and the righteousness of God.

Ahab, the king, was powerfully influenced by his queen, Jezebel, a foreign princess and a worshipper of the heathen god Baal. Jezebel's god was not concerned about justice; therefore she felt free to manipulate affairs so that her husband might take possession of Naboth's property simply because he wanted it. Naboth, however, felt responsible for his ancestral property under the Law of God (cf. Leviticus 25: 23-28), and it was Elijah, the prophet of God, who rebuked the King for his crime.

The Second Reading (Galatians 2: 15-21) is the heart of Paul's letter. It concisely states his understanding of how we are saved. Paul had first come to these gentile Galatians with the message that faith in Jesus' death and resurrection was all that was necessary for a close and right relationship with God. Then, after Paul, other Christian missionaries had come to Galatia saying that Paul was wrong, and that a Christian had to keep the Law of Moses in every detail in order to be right with God. Paul, therefore, writes back to the Galatians, very forcefully, to set them straight. He says it is not obedience to a list of legalistic obligations that gives us life, but a faith-union with the Risen Christ.

The Gospel (Luke 7: 36 - 8: 3) is Luke's story of how Jesus was anointed by a prostitute of the streets. Here we see the contrast between the "good" Pharisee who felt no real need for forgiveness, and the immoral woman who wanted desperately to be accepted. Because she knew the acceptance of Jesus she lavished her love upon him, and Jesus, in his generosity, permitted her to do so. The final paragraph (8: 1-3) tells of the women who accompanied Jesus and his disciples, looking after their physical needs. Mary Magdalene is usually identified with the prostitute just mentioned, although the text does not say so.
