REFLECTIONS ON TODAY'S READINGS

YEAR C - Proper 27

(Revised Lectionary)

TODAY'S READINGS contrast the sad lamentations over the sin and destruction of Jerusalem with the joy of Paul and Timothy. We, like them, with only a minimum of faith, can also know joy.

The First Reading (Lamentations 1: 1-6) begins the Lamentations, songs of sorrow over the destruction of Jerusalem, the Holy City.

In 587 B.C., after a long siege, the invading Babylonians got into the city, plundered it, laid it waste, and carried away all its leading citizens into captivity. The city is depicted, in this song, as a widow deprived of her husband and children. For the Jews it seemed to be the end, both of their nation and of their religion.

Yet the influence of Jeremiah is apparent here. He had been preaching throughout the siege that the fall of the city was God's will. So we read, "... the Lord has made her suffer for the multitude of her transgressions" (v. 5). Still, behind this sense of desolation was the continuing hope and faith that, in his time, God would bring his people back to Jerusalem, rebuild the city, and restore the nation.

The Second Reading (2 Timothy 1: 1-14) is Paul's exhortation (writing from prison in Rome?) to Timothy who is now in charge (i.e. the bishop) of the Church in Ephesus. (Many scholars believe that these letters to Timothy were written, not by Paul, but by someone else in his name, a little later.)

This passage encourages Timothy to be bold in evangelism, and courageous in his witness, even perhaps at the cost of martyrdom. The Gospel of Jesus Christ is a gift from God, to be carefully preserved, and lived out "in faith and love".

The Gospel (Luke 17: 5-10) is a passage about faith. The disciples here ask for an increase in faith; they want more of it. Jesus' reply is, do not to worry about that. Just a little bit of faith is all that is necessary. The parable about uprooting the tree is like Jesus' statement elsewhere (Matthew 17: 20) about faith moving mountains. It is obviously an overstatement to make the point (a regular technique of Jesus, as when he refers to a camel going through the eye of a needle in Luke 18: 25). The parable about the dutiful servants reminds us that no matter how profound our faith, or how deep our commitment, we should look for no reward, because all that we do for our Lord is no more than what he expects of us.
