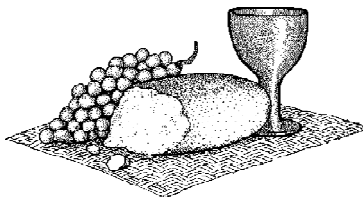

## REFLECTIONS ON TODAY'S READINGS

### YEAR B - Proper 30 (Revised Lectionary)

**TODAY'S READINGS** continue the course readings from Job, Hebrews, and Mark. A common theme today might be found in the restoring power of God. Job's condition is restored even better than it was before; Christ, our High Priest, pleads before God for our ultimate restoration; and blind Bartimaeus has his sight restored by Jesus.

**The First Reading** (Job 42: 1-6, 10-17) is the conclusion of the Book of Job. Job at last accepts God's rebuke and humbles himself before him. What is the message of this book? It is debatable. Perhaps it is that Job finds no peace while he questions God; he has to learn simply to obey him, accept his ways, and trust him. Certainly we see in Job the rebellious pride that is in us all, the tendency to think that we can do better than either God or others. But the god we question is usually a god of our own making. The bottom line, of course, is that human suffering is beyond our comprehension. It is only in the sufferings of Christ, who shares our sufferings and rises above them, that we can discover their meaning and significance (see Romans 8: 35-39).

**The Second Reading** (Hebrews 7: 23-28) brings us in this letter to the main point (to which the writer has been leading) that is, that the Aaronic priesthood of the temple has now been replaced by Christ's Priesthood. Christ's self-offering on the Cross supersedes the old daily sacrificial system, for his sacrifice is a perfect, eternal, once-for-all Sacrifice. Christ is both priest and victim, for he is the Priest who offers the Sacrifice, and he is the Victim, the one who is offered; and he continues to plead that Sacrifice eternally in heaven (v. 25). We have only to trust in him and his sacrifice to be forgiven and saved from sin.

**The Gospel** (Mark 10: 46-52) tells how Jesus restored the sight of blind Bartimaeus. This passage concludes this chapter in which Jesus struggles to show his disciples the role of the Messiah: that he must be a suffering servant. Here Bartimaeus, physically blind, was able, in his faith, to "see" just who this Jesus was and what he was about. Then, receiving physical sight, Bartimaeus followed Jesus "on the way" (v. 52) up to Jerusalem showing that true discipleship is to follow Christ in the way of his personal self-offering, and to share in his resurrection Victory.
