REFLECTIONS ON TODAY'S READINGS

YEARS A/B/C - Epiphany

(Revised Lectionary)

EPIPHANY means "manifestation" or "showing forth". Today we celebrate the "Epiphany" of Jesus, the demonstration that this Child of Mary is indeed God's Son and the Saviour of the world. The three stories traditionally associated with this festival are (1) our Lord's Baptism, (2) his changing water into wine, and (3) the coming of the wise men.

The First Reading (Isaiah 60: 1-6) is a call to joy and gladness, for God has shown to his people the glory of his salvation, and his people in turn will show that glory to the world. The passage is from Third Isaiah. The prophecies of Second Isaiah (specifically Isaiah 40) have been fulfilled: God has restored his people from exile in Babylon. Now all nations will come to know the true God by what he has done for his people. The Christian understanding of this passage is clear. The light of God's salvation has come in the Person of Jesus Christ, and all nations of the world will come to own him as their King. The references to camels, gold and frankincense, of course, speak to us of those gentiles, the wise men "from the east", who represent the peoples of the world.

The Second Reading (Ephesians 3: 1-12) repeats the theme of the Old Testament reading. Paul declares that "the mystery of Christ" (v. 4), "revealed ... by the Spirit" (v. 5) to the apostles and prophets, is now made available to gentiles as well as to Jews.

The Gospel (Matthew 2: 1-12) is the familiar story of the coming of the "wise men from the east". We are not told that there were three of them; that tradition arises from the reference to the three gifts. Nor are we told that they were kings; that is inferred from the costliness of the gifts which presumably only kings could afford. These wise men were "from the east", the seat of wisdom according to many ancient peoples. Being gentiles, they represent the peoples of the world and are traditionally depicted as being black, brown, and yellow (or white). King Herod's psychopathic fear of losing his throne was quite in keeping with his historical character. The central point of the story, however, is that the various signs (the star, Herod's fear, the wise men's search and adoration) all show how this Child is manifested or revealed as God and King to be worshipped by the whole world.
