REFLECTIONS ON TODAY'S READINGS

YEAR C - Advent 4
(Revised Lectionary)

TODAY'S READINGS bring us to the final stages in our preparation for Christmas. We consider the "little town of Bethlehem" out of which the Messiah was to come. We consider the reason for his Coming: that he came to offer himself as a sacrifice for the world. We consider the manner of his Coming, and the Virgin Mary who made it all possible.

The First Reading (Micah 5: 2-5a) is one of the classical prophecies about the Coming of the Messiah: he was to be born in Bethlehem. When people later speculated about Jesus, whether he was indeed the Messiah, reference was made to this passage (cf. Matthew 2: 6, where the Wise Men enquire of Herod; and John 7: 42: "If this Jesus is the Messiah, how is it that he comes from Galilee?"). We should recall that King David who was the popular model for the Messiah also came from Bethlehem, and that is why the town was called the "City of David".

The Second Reading (Hebrews 10: 5-10) is at first perhaps a little difficult to understand as having an Advent theme. We should remember, however, that Advent prepares us for Christ's Coming amongst us, and that the reason for his coming was to take unto himself human nature so that he might offer himself on our behalf to the Father. Christmas is not just a pretty story about the birth of a great man. Christmas tells us that God's Son became human to make a perfect offering of obedience to his heavenly Father: "See, I have come to do your will" (v. 9).

The Gospel (Luke 1: 39-45) tells the story of Mary's visit to her cousin Elizabeth. Elizabeth was "getting on in years" (v. 7) but she too was pregnant, and expecting the birth of the child who would become John the Baptist. We can presume that Mary, all agog with what was happening to her, would naturally seek out Elizabeth for support and counsel. Elizabeth calls Mary "blessed" (v. 42) and that is what we call her today (v. 48) because of her faith and obedience to God, and because of her role in bearing the Son of God. The "Magnificat", Mary's Song, used today in place of the psalm and so familiar to Anglicans familiar with Evensong, expresses how God works in the humble and lowly. And this is the spirit of Christmas.
