REFLECTIONS ON TODAY'S READINGS

YEAR C - Sunday after Christmas

(Revised Lectionary)

TODAY'S READINGS focus upon Jesus, the incarnate Son of God, growing and developing from childhood into maturity. We are shown how this occurred within the context of the Holy Family, reminding us of the fundamental role of family life.

The First Reading (1 Samuel 2: 18-20, 26) gives us a "snap-shot" of the boy Samuel growing up in the shrine at Shiloh where he "was ministering before the Lord" (v. 1) and assisting old Eli and the other priests. He wore the "linen ephod", a priestly garment. Samuel was born following the earnest prayer of his mother Hannah. Responding to this gift, Hannah dedicated her child to the Lord (1: 28) and brought him to the shrine at Shiloh, there to be raised under the supervision of Eli the High Priest. We are told how the boy Samuel "continued to grow both in stature and in favour with the Lord and with the people" (v. 26), reminding us how Luke makes the same comment about Jesus growing up in Nazareth (Luke 2: 52).

The Second Reading (Colossians 3: 12-17) exhorts us to develop in ourselves the Christian virtues. When Paul says to "clothe yourselves" (v. 12) with these virtues, we are reminded of the clean white robe that is put on at the time of Baptism, even sometimes by people today. The clean white robe represents the new pure life put upon us in Baptism. Then by God's grace we grow into that life in terms of compassion, kindness, lowliness, meekness, patience, forgiveness, love and peace. As Samuel and Jesus matured and grew in favour with God and others, so should we.

The Gospel (Luke 2: 41-52) tells the story of the boy Jesus, lost by his parents, but later found talking theology in the temple. This incident is the only information in the Gospels about Jesus' "hidden years". It was required of Jews who lived within fifteen miles of Jerusalem to go up to the temple each year for the Feast of the Passover. Other Jews were required to go at least once in their life-time. Joseph and Mary went yearly for the Festival, and took Jesus when he had come of age at twelve years. This story puts Jesus solidly within the Jewish religious tradition. At the same time it declares how he was subject to his parents (v. 51) and grew to maturity within the context of the life of his family.
