REFLECTIONS ON TODAY'S READINGS

YEAR C - Advent 2 (Revised Lectionary)

TODAY'S READINGS continue the Advent theme of "preparation". Today (and next Sunday) the dominant figure is John the Baptist who prepares the way of the Lord. John calls us also to prepare for the Coming of Christ who comes both as Saviour at Christmas and as Judge at the end of time.

The First Reading (Malachi 3: 1-4) is a passage which attempts to rouse the people of God from their lethargy. Malachi's message was given during those lack-lustre days in Judah, not long after the return from the Exile. The promised days of prosperity had not come about in the way the people had hoped, and they were depressed and losing faith. The name "Malachi" means "messenger", and so perhaps it is Malachi himself who is the messenger sent by God to warn the people, especially the "descendants of Levi" (v. 3), the priests and spiritual leaders. Christians understand that the "messenger" here refers to John the Baptist who prepared the people for the Coming of Jesus, warning them that God is a purifying God. And his warning is for us today also.

The Second Reading (Philippians 1: 3-11) is the opening paragraph of Paul's letter after the greeting. In it Paul (1) thanks the Philippian Church for their continued support (he is writing this letter from prison), and (2) prays for their continued growth in love and understanding. Paul speaks as if "the day of Jesus Christ" (vv. 6 & 10) is about to happen, and implies that their growth into Christian maturity must be completed quickly before that day arrives. This is a call to us also that we too might grow in Christian love and understanding before the coming of that Day.

The Gospel (Luke 3: 1-6) today (and next Sunday) focuses upon the person of John the Baptist, the link between the Old Testament and the New. The Baptist is the last of all the Old Testament prophets, but he is also the one who personally introduces the Messiah so long expected. Thus he marks the beginning of the Gospel story. St Luke is careful to place John solidly and precisely in human history by referring to the political figures of his day. He thus shows how God has inserted his Promised One into the ongoing stream of human events.
