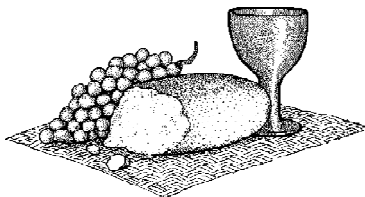

REFLECTIONS ON TODAY'S READINGS

YEAR B - Proper 29 (Revised Lectionary)

TODAY'S READINGS speak to us about humility, sacrifice and service. Job, when confronted by God, learned humility. Jesus, our great High Priest, calls us to follow him in the way of service and love.

The First Reading (Job 38: 1-7, 34-41) is God's reply to Job. It had been a long time coming. Ever since Chapter 3, when Job was so terribly afflicted by the loss of all his family, all his property, his health and even his sense of self-worth, he had been complaining about his treatment. He had understood in the traditional Hebrew way that his sufferings were a mark of God's displeasure. Yet Job knew that he was innocent. He could only conclude, therefore, that God was either unjust and arbitrary in his dealings, or he was, in fact, downright hostile. But now at last God responds. He questions Job and demands, "Who are you to question me?" (vv. 2 & 3); "Where were you when I laid the foundations of the earth?" (v. 4); "Are **you** able to run the world in all its intricate magnificence?" (vv. 34-41). So Job is humbled before God.

The Second Reading (Hebrews 5: 1-10) elaborates upon the writer's main point that Jesus is our great High Priest in Heaven. Here he shows how Jesus meets the required specifications: (1) the office is not of his own choosing but he is appointed by God; (2) he is selected from out of humanity to represent sinful humanity before God; and (3) he is able to plead to God on behalf of weak and suffering humanity because he himself suffered when he went to his cross. Christ entered into his High Priesthood by taking upon himself the Cross, and he continues to exercise that Priesthood before the throne of Grace in Heaven. The writer, in vv. 5 & 6, quotes from Psalm 2: 7 and Psalm 110: 4 to support his theme.
