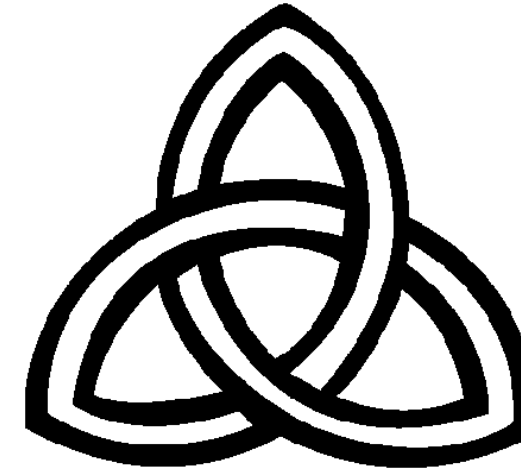

STAYING IN TOUCH

Thanks for participating in our “flash” demographic survey a few weeks ago. Our response rate was an impressive 82 per cent. Eighty-five percent use Email; 27 per cent are on Facebook; 3 per cent “tweet,” and 29 per cent use cell phones.
