REFLECTIONS ON TODAY'S READINGS

YEAR B - Proper 33
(Revised Lectionary)

TODAY'S READINGS begin to look ahead to the Advent season (which begins two weeks from today) and to pick up the Advent themes of the Coming of Christ and the Last Judgement.

The First Reading (1 Samuel 1: 4-20) tells of the miraculous birth of the prophet Samuel, anticipating the miraculous births of John the Baptist and Jesus who will soon be our focus in Advent and at Christmas. Shiloh was the central religious shrine in those days and Eli was the high priest. There a devout Israelite, like Elkanah, would take his family every year to "the sacrifice" which included feasting on the meat of the sacrifice, a rare treat for ordinary folk. One of his two wives, Hannah, had no children, so Elkanah gave her special attention; but that only made his other wife jealous and Hannah even more unhappy. The point of the story is that Hannah fervently prayed for a son, promising to dedicate the child to the service of God. He would be a Nazarite (v. 11; see Numbers 6) not just for a time but for all of his life.

The Second Reading (Hebrews 10: 11-14, 19-25) completes the image of Jesus Christ as our true High Priest. The Aaronic priests offered the morning and evening sacrifices for sin in the great temple in Jerusalem, but their sacrifices were tokens only and had to be repeated every day. But when Christ offered himself upon the Cross, he offered a Sacrifice of perfect obedience that effectively overwhelmed the power of Evil. Therefore he can now sit at the right hand of God until his kingdom is ushered in. Christ has thus opened a way for us to come "through the curtain" into the Presence of God himself. (In the temple, the curtain veiled off the "Holy of Holies", the inner sanctuary, which symbolized the Presence of God.) Now we are able, with faithful and obedient hearts, to come into that Presence, and we are called to encourage one another by our love, good deeds, and regular corporate worship.

The Gospel (Mark 13: 1-8) anticipates Advent by referring to the sufferings that must come before the end. The Jews were devastated when their magnificent temple in Jerusalem was totally leveled by the Romans in A.D. 70. We too live in a troubled and violent world, and it is here we must remain, ever constant and faithful, until the end.
