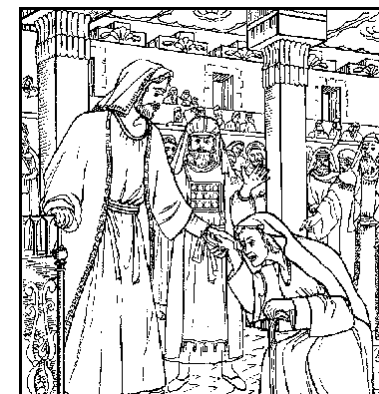

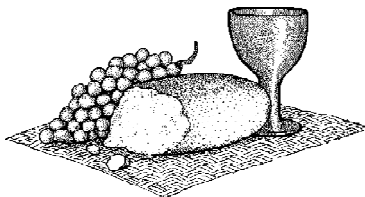

REFLECTIONS ON TODAY'S READINGS

YEAR C - Proper 21 (Revised Lectionary)

TODAY'S READINGS speak to us of the living and compassionate Presence of God. God calls us and supports us as he did Jeremiah. He is not a fearful God of laws and rules, but a God who loves and heals us.

The First Reading (Jeremiah 1: 4-10) begins readings from Jeremiah which will continue over the next eight weeks. Today we hear of Jeremiah's call to be a prophet of the Lord. Jeremiah was a young man at this time, unsure of himself, and aware of his inadequacies; but God reassures him and says he had chosen him "before he was born" (v. 5).

Of all the Old Testament prophets Jeremiah is perhaps the most Christ-like. In Jerusalem, he warned both kings and people of the immanent downfall of the nation. He rejoiced in the reforms of King Josiah (d. 609 B.C.) and deplored the pagan practices of the kings that followed him. When Jerusalem was besieged by the Babylonians he advised the people not resist but to accept defeat as God's punishment. For this he was regarded as a traitor and he suffered terribly. He was still alive when at last Jerusalem fell in 587 B.C. and those who escaped took him to Egypt where, according to tradition, he was stoned to death.

The Second Reading (Hebrews 12: 18-29) concludes the main discussion of this letter: the old life under the Law (as portrayed in the Old Testament) has been replaced by New Life in the grace of Christ (as declared in the New Testament). The Law is represented by Mount Sinai where the Law was given. The New Life in Christ is represented by Mount Zion on which the temple in Jerusalem was built and which to Hebrews symbolized the living Presence of God amongst his people.

The Gospel (Luke 13: 10-17) is a story about Jesus healing a crippled woman on the Sabbath day. (This is the last time we find Jesus in the synagogue for after this he was expelled.) The issue here was that he had done an act of healing (technically considered "work") on the Sabbath. Because it was not a matter of life and death the synagogue authorities insisted that Jesus should have waited until the next day. Jesus' reply is that acts of mercy should not be postponed. If, he says, we water our animals on the Sabbath (an act permitted by the Law) ought we not also care for each other?
