Searching for a new Rector

Anglican Church just don't go out and hire a new rector. Because finding a good match of a rector's qualifications and a parish's needs is so important and because we give great weight to the power of the Holy Spirit and the value of community discernment in the selection of a new rector, the canons (rules) of the Anglican Church provide for a very specific process. A description of the required process appears below:

Canonical Process

- ◆ **Forming a Canonical Committee:**
 - ◆ Committee should be small (5-6 people)
 - ◆ No prescribed members
 - ◆ Notices put in bulletin, verbal announcements that we are looking for volunteers for the Canonical Committee (to be done in Spring) vol-
- ◆ **Outline of the search process:**

 - ◆ Wardens meet with Executive Officer
 - ◆ Parish Search Committee is formed
 - ◆ First meeting with Executive Officer
 - ◆ Review of parish financial viability by Finance Officer
 - ◆ Prepare Parish Profile
 - ◆ Draft advertisement for review and editing by Executive Officer
 - ◆ Prepare search process budget (Interview costs, Clergy relocation costs)
 - ◆ Vacancy Advertised
 - ◆ Notice to Bishops of Western Canada
 - ◆ National Church website
 - ◆ Diocesan Weekly Newsletter
 - ◆ Applications received
 - ◆ Shortlist for Interviewing – Bishop
 - ◆ Parish Interviews
 - ◆ Written assessment on each candidate forwarded to Bishop for review
 - ◆ Bishop decided in consultation with Search Committee
 - ◆ Offer letter prepared by Bishop
 - ◆ Salary
 - ◆ Start date
 - ◆ Travel

TODAY'S EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

Our Eucharistic Prayer this morning is from the Church of England's *Common Worship*, Prayer D. It is celebratory and interactive, as befitting our Christmas Pageant and "Rose Sunday." The third Sunday of Advent in the Roman tradition is known as "Gaudete" Sunday, after the Latin *gaudete*, meaning rejoice. We pause in our more sober spiritual preparation for Christmas and find joy in the anticipation of Christmas. Often the priest would put aside the violet or blue vestments and don rose coloured vestments. So in the Anglican tradition, especially in very Anglo-Catholic parishes, this has become known as "rose" Sunday, and we light the rose candle in the Advent wreath.
