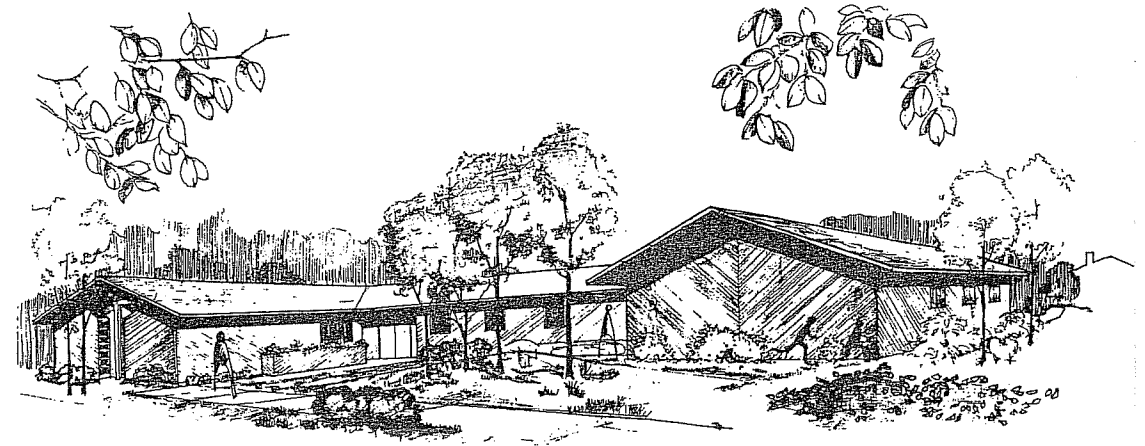

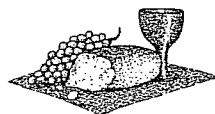

REFLECTIONS ON TODAY'S READINGS

YEAR C - Proper 22 (Revised Lectionary)

TODAY'S READINGS are lessons about faithfulness to God and about moral living. A moral life arises out of a personal and faithful relationship with God.

The First Reading (Jeremiah 2: 4-13) is God's complaint, through the prophet, that his people have been unfaithful to him. They had turned away from him to the local gods of Canaan.

The relationship between Almighty God and the Israelites had been firmly established in the wilderness, at Mount Sinai. There the people came to appreciate this God who had delivered them from Egypt, who was sustaining them there in the wilderness, and who would ultimately bring them to the Promised Land. But now, in Canaan, the land of plenty, they had discovered more congenial, less demanding gods. These were the Baals of the Canaanites.

Now the priests of God, who were supposed to teach God's Law, says Jeremiah, do not "know" the Lord (v. 8); the rulers (literally "shepherds") do not follow God's Law; the prophets prophesy by other gods (v. 10), and the people of the Lord have forsaken his "living water" (fresh life-giving streams) for the leaking cisterns of paganism (v. 13).

The Second Reading (Hebrews 13: 1-8, 15-16) winds up this letter by exhorting us to live worthy and moral Christian lives, supporting each other in "mutual love" (v. 1). We are to show hospitality to strangers, to suffer with those who suffer, especially those in prison, to be faithful in marriage, to rely not upon money to see us through but upon God, and to honour our spiritual leaders. We are to remember that Jesus Christ never changes. It is to him that we owe our worship and praise, and we serve him by serving and sharing with others.

The Gospel (Luke 14: 1, 7-14) consists of two parables set in the context of a dinner party. Jesus often used the occasion of a banquet to symbolize the "Heavenly Banquet" of the Kingdom of God. The lessons here are (1) to come humbly to the Kingdom of God and (2) to do good, looking for nothing in return. The Kingdom of Heaven lies open only to those who approach it in the spirit of unworthiness, and to those who give genuinely with no ulterior motive.
